Endings and Beginnings

As the church year ends we begin again. The end of the church year focuses on Christ coming back. The beginning of the church year focuses on Christ coming the first time. The end and beginning are tied together with Christ coming. He came in Bethlehem, but who was there? A few shepherds came, but only because angels told them to go. A few wise men from the east traveled to see Jesus, but no one else. There were a few who rejoiced; Elizabeth, Simeon, and Anna. Where was everyone else?

As we expect Christ to come back we might wonder the same thing; where is everyone? Does anyone want to come, like the shepherds, and worship the Christ? Does anyone, like the wise men, want to receive the gifts of Christ?

As pews empty, as our culture becomes increasingly hostile to Christians, and as there are many other things to occupy our time besides worship we might wonder if anyone wants or expects Christ to come back.

It has always been this way. Even in the very early days of Christianity. After Christ rose from the dead there were only 120 believers! That was it. After Jesus preached and worked miracles for three years, only 120. Many more were added on Pentecost. But then persecution began. Stephen was stoned. Saul arrested and killed Christians, that is, until Saul became a Christian. Then he was frequently arrested and often persecuted. All the apostles, except John, were killed for confessing Jesus. We should not be surprised when tribulation comes upon us. We should not be shocked when the church looks small or weak.

We look weak because of who we follow. How powerful does the Christ look hanging upon the tree? Where were the legions of angels? Where was His great kingdom? Where was His Father? No. The Christ dies in humiliation. In this way you go. You follow the crucified one and you are not above your master. The world hated Him and you are no different.

You have been baptized into Christ. You are marked by the evil one, targeted. The devil hates you and desires to do all he can to remove your faith. He will do all he is able and bring all manner of evil into your life to rip your faith from you. So don't let him. Be like Stephen and look to the Christ. Cling to Him like Mary in the garden. Receive Him in Word and Sacrament. Be where He is found for you; in church. He is there, in church, coming to you. Do not wait but receive Jesus.

Jesus will come back. We don't know when. So be prepared. Regardless of the culture or what attacks the devil has laid for you, be ready. Ready yourself through Word and Sacrament. Let nothing pull you from Christ. You are living in the middle for Christ has come once and shall come again. Receive Jesus now for the end approaches.
