Faithful to God's Word – we receive, celebrate and share Jesus Christ.

Glory

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you."

The Jews had been waiting for this. Since the promise of a Savior was given to Adam and Even it was expected that God would come and save sinners. This promise was repeated to Abram, Isaac, and Jacob. It was given to the people as they were coming up out of Egypt. Even while they were in the promised land, God reminded them of what He planned on doing. He would come and show forth His glory. He would save them.

Jesus had been waiting for this. It was all part of the Father's plan. The Father wills, the Son accomplishes, and the Spirit brings. The Father willed His Son to come to earth. At just the right time Jesus was born. He took on flesh and dwelt among us. But this was not enough. The Son would have to be glorified, that He would glorify the Father by doing His will. Jesus hints at this continually through the Gospels. He knows there is a bigger purpose for Him than the miracles He does and the parables He speaks. He knows He must be glorified.

We have been waiting for this. As we began the church year in Advent we knew that we were heading toward the glory of God. We heard about the promises of Jesus' coming. We celebrated His birth. Then we rejoiced that Jesus is the light of the world as magi came, following the star. Through Epiphany we marveled at Jesus being the light of the world, even as He was transfigured before Peter, James and John. Now we have come down from that mountain and traveled through the repentant season of Lent. We've remembered that we are dust and to dust we shall return. We know that Jesus must be glorified for us.

This week is what the people in the Old Testament had been waiting for, what Jesus had been waiting for and what we wait for each year. We often call this week "Holy Week." It begins with Palm Sunday. Jesus rides into Jerusalem to joyful shouts. The pilgrim throng celebrate Jesus as their king, "Hosannah to the Son of David!" But Jesus does not take the throne that day. Instead, He continues teaching Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday. On Thursday He celebrates the Passover with His disciples. He reinterprets the meal giving His body and blood to the disciples. Soon after that Jesus is in the Garden praying while the disciples sleep. Judas comes with the soldiers to arrest Jesus. Jesus is on trial before Pilate, Herod and Pilate again. Jesus is condemned to die.

On Friday Jesus is nailed to the tree. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Jesus is forsaken by the Father as the Father pours out His wrath over our sins on Jesus. In those moments, on the tree, Jesus is glorified. He accomplishes the will of the Father to save sinners. He takes the punishment meant for sinners and suffers for them. He suffers for you. Here Jesus is glorified! Here is what we have been waiting for - Jesus to save us!

On Saturday, the day of Sabbath rest, Jesus rests, dead in the tomb. And on Sunday, Easter, He bursts forth from the tomb as victor over death. His victory is given to you through your baptism into Him. You live because He lives. Your sins are forgiven for He has died for you. You are glorified in forgiveness because He was glorified on the cross. There is no need to wait for Jesus has accomplished our redemption. Now we come to receive and celebrate all that Jesus has done for us.

The church year reminds and focuses us on all that Jesus has done. He has followed the will of the Father and paid for your sins. He has accomplished your salvation. This Holy Week and Easter season we share that great gift together. Jesus has died to forgive our sins and was raised on Easter, the first fruits of them that sleep. This victory is yours through Jesus your Savior.


Romans 6:8-11

Elders: Pastor Kuhl will continue to serve as our Pastoral assistance. Elders have 3 board positions available, 3 candidates have been found. We will go back to passing the collection plate during worship services beginning April 2.


