Looking Behind and Ahead

As we move through the church year we have come through Advent and Christmas already. We celebrated the expectation the people in the Old Testament had as they sought the Christ. Of course, we celebrated His birth in Bethlehem that first Christmas. The wise men came to worship the King of the Jews and so did we on Epiphany! As we journey through the Epiphany season the early events in Jesus' ministry are highlighted (His baptism and call of the disciples). And soon enough Epiphany will end with the transfiguration, a reminder of who the true light is!

Epiphany gives way to Lent. Ash Wednesday is coming soon, February 14. Lent is a wonderful time to renew our zeal for God's Word and intentionally make plans to do this. You could join many at Immanuel and take the Forgiving Challenge (the book is available in the church office for \$10). You could choose to read through the Bible in a year (the reading plan for this is in the bulletin each week). You could make worship and Sunday morning Bible study a priority. You could use that Congregation at Prayer insert (found in the bulletin each week) for personal or family Bible study. I encourage you to use one of these disciplines or your own to dig deeply into God's Word.

Council Meeting January 15

Elders: The inactive and self exclusion list will be shared at the January 22 voters meeting. Budget talk will begin at our February meeting.

Trustees: Dave's Glass was out to make a quote on putting replacement plexiglass over the stained glass windows in the church. There was a discussion on replacing the fans in the church, this will likely be a two week process. A decision needs to be made on where to put the funds from the sale of the Susan Gremel house.

Evangelism: Dave Schnitker will be providing a spring concert, more info to come. We are trying to set a date for a speaker from Crossroads to come for a talk on anxiety/depression. We are considering a Pro life speaker to come in March. There are two vacancies on the Evangelism Board and two candidates to fill these: Michele Harbuck and Joyce Jahr.

Stewardship: "Exercise Your Faith", a 1-year Bible reading plan has begun. The weekly layout is in the Sunday bulletins. No one has signed up for the Dave Ramsey-Financial Peace class, it will be offered again soon. A Time, Talent and Treasure sign up sheet showing ways to get involved at Immanuel is in this newsletter, will be in bulletins and mailboxes – fill it out and return it to the church office or Stewardship mailbox. There is a Red Letter KIDS "Forgiving" that will go along with the adult study. Monthly Sunday potluck breakfasts have begun! Watch the bulletin for announcement of the next 8am breakfast gathering. Stewardship will be hosting a taco Meager Meal on February 21.

Youth: The Jimmy Jam Dance was a BIG success with 103 Jr High Kids attending and \$1,000 raised! The Jimmy Jam collection sleigh ends January 31. Thank you to all who have already donated. Watch for a pop up sledding event to come – weather depending. A Pizza dinner is being planned for the public school confirmands. An ice skating event is in the works. Super Bowl Subs are coming February 11! There will be a Linkville family event February 17. watch for more details. A Sloppy Joe Meager Meal is planned for March 6.

School Board: We have received a list to begin working on filling the Principal vacancy. A discussion was had on moving the School Board to 4 members instead of 5 following Travis

Grulke's recommendation. This would require a constitution change. Next meeting is January 30.

Pastor's Report: A vote will be made during the January voters meeting on changing the constitution to move the school board from 5 member to 4. A 2/3 vote is needed.

Old Business: A narrow table has been purchased for under the TV in the hallway, it is in the great room closet until it's needed. New "signers" have been put on accounts at Independent Bank to make them up to date.

Endowment and Capital Fund Earnings

The 2023 Endowment and Capital Fund earnings for Calendar Year 2023 are \$5,908.11, a 3.19% earning rate. These funds are available to the congregation for any viable church or school project. All requests must be made in writing indicating the amount requested and an explanation of the project. Once received, the request will be reviewed by the ECF Committee, and if approved will be recommended to the Church Council for approval of the distribution.

The funds are meant to be used for, "extraordinary items of repair or maintenance of congregational facilities, new capital additions, and special ministries of Immanuel Lutheran Church." These funds are not available for any "ordinary or necessary operating expenses" of the church.

Please submit any requests to the Endowment and Capital Fund Committee Chairman, Jim Bratton; Treasurer, Troy Strieter; or Secretary, Gary Wissner. These funds must be used by the end of Calendar Year 2024.

If any board, committee, or congregational member would like

to use these funds for a viable project of the church or school, please submit your requests to the ECF Committee putting them to work for Immanuel to the Glory of God the Father.
